### Consultations

In Kenya, since 2003, several multi-sectoral consultative fora involving government, civil society, private sector and development partners have been involved in a consultation process to develop a strategy for education for sustainable development (ESD). Since Independence, Kenya has developed various policies and strategies to address diverse sectoral needs. The ESD strategy takes cognizance of the on-going review of the educational legal framework and the newly formulated Vision 2030 for Kenya. The strategy provides an avenue for the realisation of the DESD and Vision 2030 as it embraces the participation of a broad spectrum of stakeholders involved in sustainable development and the core values of the Vision. In addition, the Strategy seeks to improve the interventions by diverse stakeholders in education through emphasis on improving the quality of education, reorienting education towards sustainable development, enhancing public awareness and capacity building. In this regard, the Strategy shall inform the ongoing review of the legal framework on education.

Kenya's education vision to have 'quality education and training for development' should provide for the development of an individual who is productive and socially responsible. The mission of education and training is to provide, promote and co-ordinate quality lifelong education, training and research. To meet these educational goals, the education sector should promote and embrace strong partnership arrangements with all stakeholders, as Kenya strives to address the challenges of sustainable development.
